The *Stitched Style* book has project instructions for little business card cases, glasses cases, headbands, and other types of accessories that look great with just a few stitched designs. Amy has added to this selection with today's easy tutorial for a fabric bracelet.

These "wrist cuffs" as they are often known are super popular – not only because they're so simple to create, but also because they add a fun splash of color and texture you don't get with more traditional bracelets. Make one or make several and stack them up your arm. They would also be sweet little gifts.
